Revision of Adjectives, Adverbs Comparatives & Superlatives

Adjectives describe a noun

- Here is a blue cup.
- Jun is happy.
- There isn't much dinner today.
- Why do you eat raw fish?
- You have been naughty!
- She's growing so tall.

Adverbs describe a verb

Adverbs often end ...ly

- Franko drives crazily.
- Erica plays the piano beautifully.
- The rate of inflation is rising steadily.
- Eunice never eats cauliflower.
- Do you snore loudly?

Strengthening & weakening adjectives & adverbs

- To <u>strengthen</u> adjectives or adverbs <u>a lot</u>: add "very" or "really"
- To <u>strengthen</u> adjectives or adverbs by <u>a smaller</u> amount: add "rather"
- To weaken adjectives: add "not very"
- You can't weaken adverbs add "very" or "really" AND negate the verb

Strengthening & weakening adjectives & adverbs

- Jun is very happy.
- You have been really naughty!
- The weather is rather bad today.
- She's not very tall.
- Do you snore very loudly?
- Franko does not drive very quickly.

Comparatives and Superlatives

(used with many adjectives and adverbs)

- Andrew is more handsome than Peter, but Peter is taller than him.
- Li Mee is more talkative than Vicky.
- Vicky is the smallest member of our Club.
- Kenneth arrived quickest. Cathy was slower.
- Kitty cooks better than Franko.

Much/Many	more	[the] most
Far	further	[the] furthest
Old (person)	elder	[the] eldest
