


## **Indefinite Pronouns**

something, somebody, someone, any, anything, anybody, anyone, all, everything, everybody, everyone, nothing, nobody, none, no one, neither, one, both, few, several, each, much, either

Used instead of a noun, but when you are not referring to a particular person or thing.

Noun or Pronoun?	
• I would like to go to Paris this summer.	<ul> <li>I would like to go somewhere this summer.</li> </ul>
• Jim gave me this book.	• Someone gave me this
Sin gave me this book.	book.
• I won't tell your secret	• I won't tell your secret to
to Sam.	anyone.
• I bought my cosmetics	<ul> <li>I bought everything at</li> </ul>
at Boots, in Beeston.	the Boots, in Beeston.

## **Some examples**

"Have you got anything that will mend this"?

"Has anyone got a pencil"?

"That's easy. Anybody can calculate that answer".

"Somebody's getting married".

"Nobody loves me".

"Both of them hate cabbage".

"Can anybody help me"? "Sorry, everybody's busy"

## Some more examples

- Everyone is sleeping in my bed.
- **Someone** is sleeping in my bed.
- No one is sleeping in my bed.
- I gave everything to Sally.
- He saw **something** in the garden.
- There is **nothing** to eat.
- I looked everywhere for my keys.
