Prepositions

A preposition is a word that links verbs, nouns (or pronouns) together. There are ~80 of them in English.

e.g. The dog barked at the cat

- The dog
- barked verb preposition
- at ← noun
- the cat

Usually a preposition is used <u>before</u> a noun and <u>after</u> a verb Can you think of some examples?

Connecting to time / place / action / principle / person / object

Each preposition has limits on what it can link ...

- ... but each preposition has different links 😕 e.g.
- The cat is **on** the chair 🖒 **on** connects to <u>a place</u>
- Lunch is **on** 12:30 (**a** on doesn't connect to a time
